>DearHeForShe,

>We would like to request you to send us one storyteller, such as Brandon Stanton of HONY, or Emma Watson, to visit us in eastern Uganda and help share with the world our plight of chronic extreme poverty – and what we are doing to end the status quo!

>We are trying to raise support for an agro-processing plant that aims to lift the rural poor (especially women) from chronic poverty, by creating new market linkages for their produce.

>Our project, the UCF, is helping the poorest rural farmers (particularly women) escape extreme poverty in eastern Uganda through income generation from fresh ginger.

Our approach is to provide poor small farmers with seed (ginger rhizomes), along with sufficient organic fertilizers and technical training on ginger growing, then pool together these farmers' produce and market it under a single umbrella.

>

>But, to counter the volatility of prices for fresh produce; achieve market scale and help our farmers get the highest prices for their produce, the UCF wants to develop an agro-processing plant to help on this.

>

>We have 286 farmers currently growing ginger. All of these farmers had never grown ginger before, and all of them got started with free ginger rhizomes, organic fertilizers and technical training that they received from the UCF.

>
